Church Services

Given the HOPE25 campaign earlier this year, we had coined 2025 'the year of hope'. The idea being to get excited about the hope contained in the Gospel.

During Term 3, to assure us of this hope, we looked at Isaiah, so we could ground our hope in God's character. The feedback was positive, with many really enjoying the challenge of working through an Old Testament book. Many reported coming away with a deeper love for God and a deeper understanding of His character.

Playtime

Playtime remains a lot of fun, and we have new families attending. We're encouraged by the number of families inviting others along! This term, we've had a few families from the growing Nepalese community join. We finished off term two with a Superhero rescue party and term three with a teddy bears picnic, both of which were well attended. One of the most exciting things for us is the deepening community that is developing as families stay behind for a couple of hours of play after Playtime. Charly and some Mums are also meeting up



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for kid-free dinners together.

This term, we have been looking at why Christmas is special. We started with Creation and the Fall, moved to the promise of a Saviour in Isaiah, and have been looking at the Christmas narratives. We've been encouraged by the number of parents who have told us how the stories are shaping and exciting their children. The children have been talking at home about what they've been learning in Playtime.

Evangelism Courses – Hope Explored and Hymns We Love James ran Hope Explored in

O'Connell in Term 3. We had three guests on week 1 and one stayed to the final week

and is still exploring. James was encouraged by the number of parishioners who invited people and for those who came to support the guests.

In preparation for an organ recital in November, we ran *Hymns We Love*. Eleven parishioners attended the course and several invited friends! One who came is now regularly coming to church! The course was well loved by the parishioners who said we should run it again next year and would be keen to invite people to the next one.

Bicentenary events

Our bicentenary events continued with another cemetery tour in September. Guests explored a different set of graves compared to the autumn tours. Furthermore, in honour of the First Fleeter buried in our cemetery, guests heard what life on the First Fleet would have

been like as we mapped out the size of one of the ships.

In November, we had our Bicentenary Organ Recital with Dr Brett McKern. Guests were treated to an excellent recital! It was wonderful to be able to sing the hymns from 'Hymns We Love' as part of the recital and enjoy the theology behind them afresh.

Bicentennial Spring Fair

October saw our second market of the year. More people came through than in Autumn, and financially, it was our most successful fete in recent memory. James was able to advertise the event on the radio twice, and one of the Wardens also got on the air. These proved to be great opportunities to share why we love Jesus with a wide audience.

We are grateful to an outstanding team from St Thomas', North Sydney, who came up for the weekend. The team were a great blessing, making balloon animals, face painting, having evangelistic conversations, and running stalls.

One particular God moment involved the organist from St Thomas' wanting to see the organ in our church. James mentioned he would be opening the church for an organist he was hoping might come and join the parish, and whose kids attend Playtime. When the second organist arrived, it just so



happened that the organist from St Thomas' had taught him how to play the organ! The second organist saw this as a sign from God, and he, his wife and kids have been coming to church!

1 to 1 Bible Study

As a way of fostering greater Bible reading in the parish and growing our BCA church partnerships, we have been piloting a 1 to 1 Bible Study with St Paul's, Castle Hill. Four of our parishioners individually meet online with their 1 to 1 reading partners from Castle Hill. They catch up, read through a section of Philippians together, and finish in prayer. So far, our parishioners have been really excited by the course and are keen to continue next year. One parishioner texted James after her first session and said, "Wow, again I say wow and thank you for this program!". Another said, "First session was amazing, interesting & fulfilling. Thank you."

We are so excited about the response that we plan to roll the program out to the whole parish, giving everyone the opportunity to read the Bible 1 to 1 with our partner churches. We look forward to seeing how God might use this program to foster deeper discipleship and strengthen partnerships.
