
The messages sent to us after Summer School and our last update have spurred us on; introductions from people who are partnering despite not knowing us, some saying "Hi" or telling us that they prayed, while others asking questions. These messages show, as a body of believers, the desire to make Jesus known.



February seems to have built up from a break away on the coast earlier in the month to busily planning what is next; new activities, routines and catch ups. It feels like the morning rush after a lazy sleep in. On one hand we want to go back to the relaxation of holidays, on the other hand we want to be in Ethiopia now.

Have you ever wanted to do one thing and feel like there are things beyond your control that are getting in the way?

We are thankful for the opportunities for rest, enabled by the generosity of a couple from the CMS fellowship, and are grateful for the church partnerships that have been formed, along with plans for visits. However, these plans don't seem to be emerging in the way that we had planned; our time away was interrupted by work commitments and Anthony has been called for jury duty with a potential for an 8-week trial. We are once again reminded that it is not what happens in our lives, but rather our identity in Christ demonstrated through love and trust in Him, and our engagement with people around us whatever the circumstance, that truly matters.



We join in thankful praise for the safe arrival of a son to Mersha, a leader in a small rural Ethiopian church, and his wife Shiberi. They have named him Bessufekad (meaning "in the will of God"). They have seen God at work as they raise their family, even though their efforts have not always gone to plan. Their first son, Dagum (meaning "second chance" after they came to faith), was stolen by family members because they were believers. This son eventually was returned, but not for 7 years! This reuniting could only be done because of the constant example of love and grace shown by all of the church members as they prayed for and engaged with the family over time; at the market, farming, in community life, as neighbours and building friendship. The family members are now reconciled and all are actively involved in caring for Dagum, Bessufekad and their sister, Naomi (meaning "compassionate despite the challenges"). Shiberi and Mersha said others have seen God's love, even though the persecution.
