Our apologies for the delay in sending the October eNews. It came to our attention this morning that only half the list had received this edition last Thursday. Thank you for your understanding.

Dear Friends,

"Putting money in second place, not first" is a core principle for CMS. Around 150 years ago, CMS decided they would follow a 'policy of faith'. CMS would send out any number of true-hearted missionaries, trusting the Lord of the harvest to supply the funds for this blessed undertaking.

We exercise this faith as a fellowship of his people, praying the Lord of the harvest will supply the missionaries, and the funds needed to send them. And, as a fellowship, we respond to those prayers through long-term financial commitment. Missionaries have a real sense that supporters are in an active relationship with them to send them for the long-term. Money in second place doesn't mean we don't think about the financial implications. Rather, it means we pray and give in obedience to the Lord's command.

In the 2024-2025 financial year, we need to increase our giving by 16.6%. Due to the increase in our missionary numbers, our branch is contributing a larger share of our total fellowship costs. We are also investing in our IT to ensure we are protecting both missionary and supporter information. So far, we haven't seen our giving grow

to support this increase.

On average, about 1 in 5 supporters who receive missionary newsletters give regularly to their support. Please pray that the Lord would inspire our fellowship to provide what is needed to encourage and support our current missionaries, and, by his grace, send many more!

Parfait in Bible Adventure devotion

Rachel Hughes in Japan wants to share a story that took place during a recent Bible devotion with children and parents...

"We rarely receive verbal encouragement from others in Japan, it's not really a common part of the culture. At Bible Adventure we played a card game as a

summary of our series of Old Testament and New Testaments characters. After the game, we made parfaits and I gave a devotion about ways the Bible is like a parfait: there are many layers, but they come together to make one thing like there are many characters and stories that come together to make one, whole Bible; each person has their own way of making their parfait, God arranged and included each part of the Bible the way he wants it to be (so we can't just pick and choose the bits we like).

Afterwards, we shared photos on a line group and one of the mums made the following comment publicly to the group: 'Thank you, Rachel, for another wonderful time. I think the children really enjoyed listening to you talk about how the Bible is like a parfait, filled with various messages from God. The French word "parfait," from which the word parfait is derived, means "perfect" or "complete. Let's continue to enjoy learning the teachings of the Bible, which is a perfect gift from God .' We were super encouraged by her thoughtful encouragement!"



FINANCE UPDATE

The branch received \$337,864 in donations in the first quarter of FY2025; this is \$133,682 (28%) below budget. Due to the growth of QNNSW missionaries in the last few years, our branch's share of CMS fellowship costs has increased significantly. This is a good challenge we are facing. Would you pray that more supporters will share the burden of sending missionaries to share the gospel that Jesus reigns!




- Our members as they vote to approve the revised Rules of Association

- Our new missionaries, Bill and Linda Colyer and Steph Hawkins, who will share their plans for ministry


