


Mountains Anglican Refugee Support

Exciting News!

A New Refugee Household to arrive soon



On 23 October MARS-LM formally committed to supporting another Refugee Household.

We expect to welcome Fatemeh and her two teenage daughters, Nasim and Maryam sometime in late November.

This family are ethnic Afghans who have been living in Iran. They speak Farsi (Persian). They have been granted Permanent Residence in Australia, and will be entitled to Centrelink Support.

Our plan is to initially settle this family in some local temporary accommodation and work with them according to their presenting needs.

We will at a later date request material support (such as gathering items for an initial pantry). We will also request furniture and appliances once we know what this family needs. We cannot store furniture and appliances and at the moment do not know what they will need.

As you can imagine, coming to a new country with a different language and culture can be overwhelming, so we ask you to pray for this family, and for a safe and smooth migration to Australia and that they settle well amongst us.

Funding

Our Finances

We are grateful for your financial support. For our first sponsorship of both Raziyeh and Marzieh, we had sufficient finances to meet the needs of our ministry with them and help set them up for their life's journey in Australia (and beyond).

When we enter the agreement to sponsor a refugee household, we are required to have a budget and at least half the required funds in a dedicated bank account. For this next phase, as we prepare for the arrival of Fatemeh and her daughters Nasim and Maryam, we are approximately two-thirds funded.

We have been given a grant from the Coopers Foundation for approximately half our budget under the category of 'Fostering family and community support based on Christian values.'

Marzi has had a reasonably stable six months since moving to Blacktown where she shares a small unit with another Afghan lady. She has continued to study at TAFE completing a course in cyber security and is now studying one in computer networking. Her aim is to do a higher level course in cyber security and hopefully to get a job in that field.

She has some part-time work in an alteration business. As you can see, she has attained her Driving License. Recently she applied to do some voluntary translation work - her English is very good!

Our Ministry

We attach an article from the UK Telegraph about the potential deportation of about two million Afghans from Iran. This article will give you some feel of what it is to live in a country where you are not wanted.

So far, our ministry has been to Afghans who have been resident in Iran.

We see what we do as more than philanthropy, we see this as a ministry. That of being Ambassadors for Christ (2 Corinthians 6:20). We know that all our actions either draw credit to Jesus, or detract from him being known.

We are part of a Church that places value on Jesus being known by as many people as possible. Fatemeh and her daughters will emigrate from a country where comparatively few people know Jesus, and to change religion (especially from Islam) is a punishable offence. Therefore, even to step inside a church will be difficult. As our Church family warmly welcomed Raziyeh and Marzieh, (and others), clearly showing that knowing Jesus is for everybody, we pray that Fatemeh, Nasim and Maryam will also feel welcomed and at home.

This is a relationship ministry – where we do not know in advance, how we will be received, and what the outcomes of the coming year will be. The ministry requires us 'to step out in faith' and do something out of our comfort zone, a little bit risky, but well worth it. We invite you to continue to partner with us in the ministry of MARS.

 prepare to come to Australia, that they would settle well, be open to our
 ministry, and make friends.
- For Raziyeh and Mohammed as they settle in New Zealand.
