'Goodbye' Google Translate




Recently, Rani went to register Alexi for *maternelle* (pre-school). She was



taken on a tour by the very chatty secretary, met the class teacher, and filled out a massive stack of paperwork...all in French! This came almost exactly a year after doing pretty much the same thing for daycare...but with zero language and exclusively using Google translate (yep that was pretty motivating!) Our French is definitely still very 'rough-and-ready', but we praise God that it now kind-of, actually 'works'!

Literal doors opening...

Over this past year, we've spent a lot of time praying for relationships. We've seen God open up some great connections at language school and also with ministry people in Brussels. But our apartment building has definitely been one of the tougher spaces to crack. In the last month, however, we've received what has felt like a flood of invitations 'in' - to tea, brunch, a birthday celebration, even semi-regular conversation practice. All great answers to prayer! We'd love you to keep praying for relational doors to 'swing open' in all areas of our life here.



Becoming more 'textured' Christians



About a year ago, we could identify as Christians in French, but that was about it. Recently however, we've had small but regular opportunities to talk about our faith in the class-room and with our neighbours. Amusingly, in these circles we feel like we've become



known as the 'Australian Protestants' (affectionately, we hope!) We're enjoying figuring out what this new label means and the opportunities it presents (especially as our French grows) to share Jesus in a more 'textured' way in our new context.

Above - recently, we both gave short class presentations where we shared tangentially from the Bible. Afterwards, our teacher opened up a class discussion on Protestantism, where our classmates asked us questions, and quite amazingly, all laid their 'spiritual cards' on the table. Please pray for some good follow-up conversations!





At this stage, we're about half way through our 'dedicated' season of learning language and culture (though in reality we know this will never end!)

This means that we expect to spend the next year in full-time French study, while taking (we pray) more and more opportunities to press into culture and relationships here. As our French progresses, we also expect to begin conversations about our future service with GBU. Watch this space!
