NSW AEF family camp

AEF and BCA share a relationship demonstrating the oneness in Christ we are called to live out. BCA has partnered with the AEF on various initiatives, including supporting the AEF NSW Family Camp.

2024's event was held in Condobolin, NSW, and approximately 350 people attended. People travelled from across the country, including Perth (WA), Adelaide (SA), and Brisbane (QLD).

The camp is always a wonderful time of fellowship, showcasing the oneness we share in the gospel. The gathering includes people from various denominations and ethnic backgrounds.



This year's theme was 'The Victorious Life', with keynote speakers Phil Wheeler and Terrence Lennon. Phil pastors Living Water Indigenous Church, while Terrence, his understudy, is also a BCA bursary student. It was a blessing to hear Terrence open the Scriptures and guide us through the theme. This is what true gospel partnership looks like.

In the evenings, several leaders opened the Bible for us. Pastor Tom Sloane, an Indigenous leader, preached on Friday night, while Phil Spiers, who is not Indigenous, shared on Saturday evening. Jono Manton, another Indigenous leader, preached on Sunday night.

David and Alana Burges and their team once again led the children's ministry, and they did an

excellent job.

Kathie Bird spoke at the ladies' meeting, and David Cox led the men's session. Both were well attended, with around 70 men and women at each gathering.

We are so grateful for our BCA Nomads, who helped with various tasks around the campsite, including meal preparation. Some sittings saw 400 meals served, with people often coming back for seconds due to the quality of the food!

A special mention goes to Kerry Gainsford, who, despite farewelling her mum last year, still dedicatedly coordinated the meals. We pray God continues to bless Kerry for her faithful service.



A big thank you also goes to the musicians, most of whom play by ear without formal training. Their talent for country gospel music brought the camp alive.

We're already looking forward to this year's family camp, which will again be held in Condobolin. Nathaniel Naden has agreed to be the keynote speaker, with the theme 'Better Together: Christian Unity in the Gospel', drawing lessons from the Corinthian church.

A flyer for this year's camp is in the works and will be distributed soon. Why not plan to join us as we seek to show what true reconciliation looks like?
