The Armidale diocese sent Andrew and Margie Newman as CMS missionaries to support the college and they have also been supporting annual youth conferences to equip youths with skills to handle God's word correctly. To top it off, I managed to complete a gospel introduction course (JesusWorks) with my parents that we started during lockdown, and they confessed faith in Jesus. I don't have enough words to express my gratitude to you for supporting me to join the trip and for your ongoing partnership with me in gospel ministry and I pray that God will bear much fruit from our partnership!
