WHO IS WILLIAM TAYLOR?



William Taylor grew up on a farm in Cornwall. He served in the British Army as an Officer in the Royal Green Jackets for five years before being ordained. In 1995 he joined St Helen's Church, Bishopsgate, in the heart of the City of London, and became Rector in 1998. The ministry at St Helen's has for many years had a focus on reaching the business community; there are also vibrant Sunday Congregations reaching amongst others, students, young workers, families and internationals. William is married to Janet, and they have three adult children – Emily, Digby and Archie. He has authored some books to help people understand the Bible including, 'Partnership', 'Understanding the Times', 'The Word One to One', 'Style or Substance?', 'Revolutionary Sex' and 'Revolutionary Work'. He was a contributor to the 'Proclamation Bible'. He is also editor of the 'Read Mark Learn' series: 'John', 'Romans' and 'Luke (volumes 1 and 2)'.

CATERING

TRANSPORT & PARKING

Parking immediately in front of the church (Raymond St) will be limited to those with mobility issues. Parking across the road next to and inside the school will be for families with young children and strollers. Schoolhouse Lane should be kept free for shuttle bus drop offs.

Other parking options in Glenbrook are at the Glenbrook Oval carparks (Hare St and Moore St), Glenbrook Station car park, Moore St, King St and Levy St.

Shuttle cars will be in operation to ferry everyone to Glenbrook.

Blaxland: Buses will depart every 20 minutes from LMAP Blaxland starting at 8:20am, with the last one leaving at 9:20.

Onsite parking is available at Blaxland, while some overflow parking is available in Taringha St, Bourke St and Ross Cres (past Taringha St).

Mt Riv: Buses will depart every 25 minutes from LMAP Mt Riv starting at 8:25am, with the last one leaving at 9:15am.

Onsite parking is available at Mt Riv, while some overflow parking is available on Rusden Rd from the Fire Station, and in Elizabeth Rd, but do not park at the shops, as this is City Church's car park.
