Supporting students in Liège to make Jesus known...



Liège (pictured above) is a university city about 90 minutes from the centre of Brussels. The core GBU group is around 5-6 students, supported remotely by the Brussels staff team. This month, we had the joy of accompanying these students to plan, promote and execute a games and testimonies evening. As you can see below, it was a great learning experience (for them and for us) and were encouraged to see God at work!



There are some fairly strong prosperity Gospel currents in the Belgian Christian scene, which mean that testimonies sometimes have a tendency to focus on "how Jesus helps us in times of difficulty", rather than the life-changing power of his death and resurrection. In response to this, we wrote and led some training to help students share their story through a Gospel lens. Above you can see us midway through our

definition ("a testimony is a personal story which proclaims the death and resurrection of Jesus"), asking what each part adds, and what we'd lose without it.





We each caught the train to Liège on different days to help the students distribute flyers for the event. Praise God for their real courage and ownership (above you can see pretty much the whole GBU group!). Despite this win, we ended up *flyering* at unideal locations and times, so weren't very effective... This is one of the challenges of supporting students remotely, with limited capacity to meet and strategize about how to best do mission on the ground. Please pray for wisdom for GBU staff as we support these students by distance, and that God would raise up future staff for Liège.



Praise God that on the night, the core Liège group were outnumbered more than 5-1! Of the 30 students who came, almost all were invited personally by members of the group. The evening had a really warm and fun atmosphere, with lots of games, laughter and a meal together. K (pictured) gave a clear, faithful and personal testimony of Jesus' work in her life...and in front of a much bigger crowd than expected! **Praise God for his work in-and-through this group of faithful students!**







We also thank God for some great insights from the evening for us as new staff. This included realising we need to support students more closely (the other student who shared his testimony sadly didn't speak very much of Jesus), and encourage them more explicitly to talk to guests! This kind of learning is invaluable for us as we learn how to better support students in the future.
