## 'Hérauts': a glimpse of what it looks like to be a herald of the Gospel in Belgium...



You might be suprised that Hérauts was actually really different to our experience of uni ministry conferences in Australia (and we've been to a few!).

Of course, there were plenty of **'familiar' things** - faithful Bible teaching, lots of singing, the buzz of students gathered together...

But there were also some **key differences** - and not just that it didn't involve bunk beds, or that lunch came with dessert!

Below we've shared what stood out to us. We'll leave any comparisons to an Aussie context up to you. But we think you'll be able to notice **some distinctives in what it looks like to be a 'herald' of the Gospel in Belgium** (where evangelical Christians make up only 1.4% of the population)...as well as **some real strengths that God is forming in the GBU** as it seeks to meet the challenges of this setting.



A focus on evangelism. 'Hérauts' is the one conference GBU runs and every year the focus is on equipping students for evangelism. This was reflected in the strong Gospel focus of the main sessions, seminar topics, the book stall, even the song choices. In all these things, we could see the GBU's deep heart for mission in a strongly secular context.

A hub for Christians of different backgrounds. Far from being an 'inhouse' event, 'Hérauts' brought together students and people who minister to students from many different contexts in French-speaking Belgium and northern France. We loved seeing this very deliberate leadership in Gospel unity, especially in a context where the harvest is plentiful but the workers are few (Matthew 9:37).

**the scenes.** In this picture you can see a student, members of local churches, GBU staff, and future GBU staff...a good summary of just **how many different 'hands' were on deck** to make the conference run (note - we also spied graduates, supporters and board members pitching in before, during and after the day). It was great to see the many parts of a **'broader GBU body' in action** (1 Corinthians 12), pooling resources and partnering in a very 'hands on' way for God's kingdom.
