### **Dear friends**

The foundation of the gospel is that God is a righteous judge--apart from this we have no need of a Saviour. While many cultures historically have had a strong sense of accountability to God (or 'the gods'), this is much less the case today in the West--in fact, for many, the very idea is offensive. This challenge is one of the things that we wrestle with at Tyndale as we seek to equip our students to contextualise the gospel without in any way watering it down--the latter being an ever-present temptation in the European context. Please pray that God would give us wisdom as we do this, and also open doors for us bear witness to the 'righteous judge' who also bore the penalty, as we prepare for the Christmas season.

In October, Tyndale hosted a symposium to commemorate the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the Tyndale New Testament. Both David and Cathie gave presentations for this--David an introduction, and Cathie a paper on Tyndale within the context of Christian humanism. This was well received, and it was a privilege to be able to honour Tyndale's namesake, who is a big inspiration to us!

At Via Church, we were privileged to have a visit by the bishop of the Anglican Convocation in Europe, to which we belongwe had a lovely time together, and it was an encouragement to us all.

#### **Meet Aron and Ravenna**



Aron graduated from Tyndale this past May. He lives in Arnhem (a bit more than an hour from Tyndale) with his wife Ravenna, and their three girls. David had him in several of his classes, and found him a joy to teach. He was one of our Dutch students, and came to us in order to prepare for pastoral ministry in the Baptist church in the Netherlands. He was able to come to Tyndale scholarship recipient, which allowed him to study here while working part-time and serving in his church.

Reflecting on his time at Tyndale, Aron says that it has 'equipped me to serve the church in preaching and teaching the Word of God faithfully. It has shown me convincingly the necessity of preaching the gospel of Jesus Christ and also has given me the means to point people to our Lord from every passage in Scripture. Tyndale... has helped me also with the means to contextualise the message of the gospel for a secularised culture (like ours in the city of Arnhem) by training me in understanding today's culture and its underlying belief systems.'

Since graduating, Aron has been brought in as an associate pastor at his home church, which he was praying and hoping he would be able to do. However, as is often the case in Europe, his church is not able to pay him a full-time salary. We thank God for Aron, and for the privilege of equipping him here at Tyndale. Thank you for your part in making it possible for students like him to study here: it is only because our faculty are supported as missionaries that Tyndale is able to provide such generous scholarships. Please pray for Aron and his family, that God would continue to open doors for ministry, and to provide for all of their needs.

Cathie has continued to be involved in leading the local Kids' Club, and several neighbourhood children (and some mothers and a grandmother) came to the Reformation Day event on Halloween, We are looking forward to the Christmas season, and to the opportunities it will provide for outreach. Please pray in particular for the Via Christmas Eve service, for the Kid's Club Christmas event on the 20<sup>th</sup>, which Cathie will be helping to lead, and for a Christmas party in our home that we are planning to invite our non-Christian neighbours to.
